MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OCTOBER 16, 2000

The City Council of Red Bay met in a regular meeting **October 16, 2000**, at 7:00 P.M.

Present and presiding was Mayor Tommy G. Nelson and Council Members present: Peggy Cox, Johnny Cleveland, Jimmy Mayfield, Lowell Gober, and Eucellis Underwood.

Shirley J. Cody, City Clerk, was present and recording.

Johnny Cleveland led the Invocation.

Jimmy Mayfield led the Allegiance to the Flag.

Others present were Police Chief "Reb" Boatwright, City Inspector Bob Hardin, Animal Control Officer Randoll Belue, Fire Chief Bud Strickland and Lynn Grissom.

Mayor Nelson commended Bud Strickland, Lynn Grissom and the Fire Department for doing the job well. Our purpose is to protect all people. No more calls for a grass or wood fire out of the jurisdiction will be answered unless a barn or house is in danger during daytime working hours.

Lowell Gober made a motion to appoint and reappoint the following persons to the City Tree Commission: John Morrow, Herbert Trulove, Larry Smith, Carlton Lofton, James Neal Thompson and James Lovette. The motion was seconded by Jimmy Mayfield. Unanimously passed.

Eucellis Underwood made a motion to replace Bill Nabers on the Park & Recreation Board since he is the Park Manager and appoint Tommy Cox to the Park and Recreation Board, seconded by Lowell Gober. All voted FOR except Peggy Cox, she ABSTAINED.

Peggy Cox made a motion to close the Airport Board, seconded by Johnny Cleveland. Unanimously passed.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion to reappoint Gary Page to the Housing Authority of Red Bay, seconded by Jimmy Mayfield. Unanimously passed.

Jimmy Mayfield made a motion to put off the request made from the FFA Organization until next October 1, 2001, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Letters from the kids at school were shown to the council thanking them for the Red Bay News.

Benjamin Raburn is doing good in school. He is to graduate November 15, 2000.

Lowell Gober made a motion to hire Mike Fancher on the Sanitation Department to replace Bradley Umfress who quit to work for Tiffin Motor Homes, seconded by Johnny Cleveland. Unanimously passed.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion no more than one continuance granted on any court case brought into city court unless in case of a death or the mayor or council approves it to be continued. The motion seconded by Jimmy Mayfield. Unanimously passed.

Peggy Cox made a motion to hire Stephen Eric Moore as a 911 dispatcher, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Peggy Cox made a motion to change court date from November 3rd to November 9th at 1:00 P.M., seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Peggy Cox made a motion to go into "Executive Session" because of an individual's character or good name, seconded by Lowell Gober. No action was taken.

Jimmy Mayfield made a motion to pay due bills, seconded by Lowell Gober. All voted FOR except Eucellis Underwood, he ABSTAINED on Underwood True Value bill.

Peggy Cox made a motion to approve previous minutes, seconded by Jimmy Mayfield.
Unanimously passed.

Ray Fretwell requested a letter be written to Galaxy Cable vision, David Lusby, requesting that Station 59, Unity Broadcasting, located in Russellville, Alabama be added to the cable network.

Eucellis Underwood made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.
