MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
FEBRUARY 5, 2001

The City Council of Red Bay met in a regular meeting February 5, 2001, at 7:00 p.m.

Present and presiding was Mayor Tommy G. Nelson and Council Members present: Peggy Cox, Johnny Cleveland, Jimmy Mayfield, Lowell Gober, and Eucellis Underwood.

Shirley J. Cody, City Clerk, was present and recording.

Jimmy Mayfield led the Invocation.

Johnny Cleveland led the Allegiance to the Flag.

Others present were Police Chief "Reb" Boatwright, City Inspector Bob Hardin, Patrolman Benjamin Raburn, Patrolman Scotty Chandler and wife, Heather, and Richard Carter, representative of the Franklin County Times.

Chief Boatwright presented Scotty Chandler with "Officer of the Year" award for 2000. Patrolman Raburn was commended for doing a good job on a recent incident in the city jail.

Richard Carter explained last year's ad in the Progress Addition of the Franklin County Times. The cost of the full page ad is \$827.00. The color is free.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion to buy the ad, seconded by Jimmy Mayfield. Unanimously passed. Peggy Cox is to handle the information for the ad.

Lowell Gober made a motion to accept the cheapest bid from Kemper in the amount of \$47,238.00 for the Municipal Package Insurance Policy, seconded by Eucellis Underwood.

Unanimously passed.

The 2001 Alabama League of Municipalities Convention will be held in Montgomery, Alabama, May 19-22, 2001. Those wishing to attend let us know in order to make reservations.

A one day seminar for elected officials will be held in Huntsville, March 21, 2001.

Peggy Cox made a motion to change the name of the Dixie Youth Program to Red Bay Little League, seconded by Johnny Cleveland. Unanimously passed.

Jimmy Mayfield made a motion to keep the 1997 Chevrolet Police Car for City Hall use and sell the 1997 Nissan Path Finder, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed. The city will accept bids on the path finder until March 5, 2001, at 4:00 p.m. The Council has a right to no sale.

The sewer rates will remain the same as approved by the Sewer Board for this fiscal year.

Peggy Cox made a motion to go with Bell South as the Internet provider, seconded by Jimmy Mayfield. Unanimously passed.

Eucellis Underwood made a motion to continue to pay for Internet services at Red Bay High School, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion to accept Air-Evac Emergency Unit to service City of Red Bay beginning at Highway 21 West and our ambulance service and 911 area, seconded by Jimmy Mayfield. Unanimously passed.

Mayor Nelson introduced ORDINANCE #01-02-05, AIR-EVAC AND CITY OF RED BAY.

Jimmy Mayfield made a motion to adopt Ordinance #01-02-05, Air-Evac and City of Red Bay 911 Jurisdiction, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Lowell Gober made a motion that Franklin County Commission pay for the phone and fax services being used in the tag office located in Red Bay, seconded by Johnny Cleveland. Unanimously passed.

Lowell Gober made a motion to send a letter to Jacky Warhurst notifying him that the city will no longer pay the phone and fax bill as of March 1, 2001, at the tag office, seconded by Jimmy Mayfield. Unanimously passed.

Jimmy Mayfield made a motion to pay due bills, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Lowell Gober made a motion to approve previous minutes, January 15, 2001, seconded by Peggy Cox. Unanimously passed.

Eucellis Underwood made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.
