MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
JULY 16, 2001

The City Council of Red Bay met in a regular meeting July 16, 2001, at 7:00 p.m.

Present and presiding was Tommy G. Nelson and Council Members present: Peggy Cox, Johnny Cleveland, Lowell Gober, and Eucellis Underwood. Absent was Council Member Jimmy Mayfield.

Shirley J. Cody, City Clerk, was present and recording.

Matthew Senkbeil age 5, grandson of Mayor Nelson, led the Invocation.

Josh Senkbeil, grandson of Mayor Nelson, led the Allegiance to the Flag.

Others present were Police Chief "Reb" Boatwright and City Inspector Bob Hardin. "Reb" Boatwright reported that drug day had been changed to Saturday, August 11, 2001.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion for the Fire Department to have a first alert team and a second alert team when fire calls are received, seconded by Peggy Cox. Unanimously passed.

Peggy Cox made a motion to keep the Family Park open on Saturday and Sunday from 1:00 p.m to 5:00 p.m. after school starts August 10, 2001, also bookings for parties anytime Monday thru Friday at night, seconded by Eucellis Underwood. Unanimously passed.

Lowell Gober made a motion to donate \$1,000.00 to the D.A.R.E. Program at Vina High School, seconded by Johnny Cleveland. Unanimously passed.

Mayor Nelson reported to the council the Rabies Clinic would be held one more week end.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion to give Quinn Ranch Children's Home representatives permission for a road block at intersection of Golden Road and Highway 24 on August 11th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m., seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Lowell Gober made a motion to enter into a contract service with the Franklin County Chamber of Commerce in the amount of \$4,800.00 per fiscal year 2001-2002, seconded by Eucellis Underwood. Unanimously passed.

The monthly inspection of the landfill scales was a good report.

The sidewalks are started in Miller Subdivision.

Peggy Cox made a motion to pay \$3,000.00 to Red Bay School Quarterback Club since there has been a cut back in teachers. A coach was needed for Junior High grades 7,8, and also for grade 9. Lowell Gober seconded the motion. Unanimously passed.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion to pay due bills, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed with the exception of Eucellis Underwood abstaining from Underwood True Value Hardware bill.

Peggy Cox made a motion to approve minutes of June 18, 2001, seconded by Eucellis Underwood. Unanimously passed.

Eucellis Underwood made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.
