MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
APRIL 1, 2002

The City Council of Red Bay met in a regular meeting April 1, 2002, at 7:00 p.m.

Present and presiding was Mayor Tommy G. Nelson and Council members present were Peggy Cox, Johnny Cleveland, Lowell Gober and Eucellis Underwood. Council member Jimmy Mayfield was absent.

Shirley J. Cody, City Clerk, was present and recording.

Johnny Cleveland led the Invocation.

Peggy Cox led the Allegiance to the Flag.

Others present were Police Chief "Reb" Boatwright, City Inspector Bob Hardin, and Bob Rogers, Chairman of the Franklin County Development Authority.

"Reb" requested permission for a road block, April 6th, 9:00 a.m. till 12:00 noon for the March of Dimes. Johnny Cleveland made a motion to approve the request for the road block, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Rogers explained the need for the FCDA. The money was arrived at \$7.00 per citizen who lives in the city limits (3374) = \$23,618.00 yearly. He asked for a three year commitment until permanent funding takes place. Also they are asking the Alabama Legislative for a severance tax on sand and crushed limestone. If passed this will provide permanent funding.

Peggy Cox made a motion to pledge the city's support in the amount of \$11,809.00 to the FCDA for remainder of year and to support it in a three year program as long as the city has funds to do so, seconded by Johnny Cleveland. Unanimously passed.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion to advertise for bids on a new roof in Bay Tree Park, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

On recommendation of "Reb" Boatwright, Johnny Cleveland made a motion to hire Lesly Adams as a dispatcher, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Peggy Cox made a motion to donate \$100.00 to the Senior Citizen Program, seconded by Eucellis Underwood. Unanimously passed.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion the weather sirens be tested the 1st Monday of each month at 12:00 noon, seconded by Peggy Cox. Unanimously passed.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion to pay due bills, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

The council supports the Civitian Club in redoing the WELCOME SIGNS.

Lowell Gober made a motion to approve previous minutes of March 18, 2002, seconded by Eucellis Underwood. Unanimously passed.

Eucellis Underwood made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.
