MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
AUGUST 5, 2002

The City Council of Red Bay met in a regular meeting August 5, 2002, at 7:00 p.m.

Present and presiding was Mayor Tommy G. Nelson and Council Members present were Peggy Cox, Johnny Cleveland, Jimmy Mayfield, Lowell Gober, and Eucellis Underwood.

Shirley J. Cody, City Clerk, was present and recording.

Jimmy Mayfield led the Invocation.

Peggy Cox led the Allegiance to the Flag.

City Inspector Bob Hardin was present. Police Chief "Reb" Boatwright and Fire Chief Bud Strickland was absent. Monica Isbell representing the Red Bay Band Boosters was present.

Monica Isbell requested permission to have a road block to raise funds for desperate needed band uniforms and any financial help the city could provide. Permission was granted for the road block the 3rd Saturday if weather permits and in case of rain the following Saturday at intersection Highway 24 and Golden Road from 9:00 a.m to 1:00 p.m.

A letter from Senator Roger Bedford to the Department of Economic Affairs concerning the walking trail has been sent to Governor Don Siegelman for approval.

A letter from Governor Don Siegelman approving the grant for video systems for the police cars in the amount of \$6,700.00.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion to accept John Morrow's resignation from the Red Bay Tree Commission, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Eucellis Underwood made a motion to appoint Ann Vinson to the Red Bay Tree Commission, seconded by Jimmy Mayfield. Unanimously passed.

Peggy Cox made a motion to spend approximately \$2,425.00 on the fire station for repairs, seconded by Johnny Cleveland. Unanimously passed.

Lowell Gober made a motion to give a cost of living raise for city employees, seconded by Johnny Cleveland. Unanimously passed.

The original Grant Agreement No. ADECA-2002-DO-261 in the amount of \$18,747.00 to be used for the construction of a new helipad has been received from Governor Don Siegelman to be signed and returned.

Peggy Cox made a motion to add names to a witness list on behalf of the Red Bay Hospital. A letter was written opposing the Certified of Needed Application for an Ambulatory Surgery Center in Colbert County, Alabama. The motion was seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Jimmy Mayfield made a motion to approve a 1/4 page School Safety Rules ad in the amount of \$167.00, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Drug Awareness Day will be Saturday, August 10, 2002, at the Family Fund Park from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Johnny Cleveland made a motion to approve due bills, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.

Lowell Gober made a motion to approve previous minutes, seconded by Jimmy Mayfield. All voted FOR except Johnny Cleveland, he ABSTAINED.

Eucellis Underwood made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Lowell Gober. Unanimously passed.
